Artist Sean Starr visits the country of Nepal to explore the country's extraordinary array of traditional handcrafted arts.

SYNOPSIS

Artist Sean Starr watched his own trade of sign painting nearly vanish in the age of digitization. Compelled to see what kinds of craftsmanship still exists on the other side of the world, Sean embarks on a journey to Nepal to meet other artistisans such as: thangka painters, wood carvers, singing bowl manufacturers, paper makers, basket weavers, and other sign painters.

The film culminates with a motorcycle trek into the himalyas where Sean meets the Magar people and paints a mural on their elementary school. The Magar's primary artform is music and dance, which vividly illustrates the joy and significance of passing down traditional arts forms from one generation to the next.

For decades, Visual Artist Sean Starr's original artwork has been displayed in exhibitions at galleries in New York, San Francisco, Los Angeles, Dallas, Houston, Napa Valley, Philadelphia, Chicago, San Antonio and Ireland.

Blending his background as an artist, sign painter, designer and illustrator, Sean Starr has achieved an international reputation while working with other artists such as The Cranberries, Fleetwood Mac's Lindsay Buckingham, The Toadies, Reese Witherspoon, and Gogol Bordello's Eugene Hutz.

Starr was featured in the film and book "Sign Painters" and his work has seen coverage in media such as the Discovery Channel, NBC, Robb Report, Dallas Observer, Juxtapoz and ArtForum magazines.

Sean operates Starr Studios located in Central Texas and most of his original work today consists of gold leaf on glass known as verre eglomise.

Tashi is a third generation
Thangka master, with over 20
years of experince. Tashi is
also the owner of Rincheling
Thangka Gallery and Art
School in Boudha just steps
away from the Boudhanath
Stupa in Nepal where he passes down the traditional craft
of Buddhist scroll painting.



LALIT PRAJAPATI

Lalit is a potter working in Bhaktapur with a traditional non-electric wheel which he spins with a stick. At the time of filming, Lalit was 78 years old, and showed no signs of slowing down the craft which had been passed down for many generations in his family.



RAJU SHRESHTHA

Raju is a sound healer working with hand made singing bowls at the Golden Temple Singing Bowl Shop & Healing Center in Lalitpur, Nepal. Raju specializes in the tune, frequency, vibration, art, sound, and chakras related to this form of holistic healing.



KRISHNA MAYA SHILPAKAR

Krishna Maya is the matriarch of the Shilpakar family and oversees the operations at the Dattatraya Woodcarving Factory, a family business that produces architectural and decorative wood carvings, all hand made by techniques that have been in the family for over 400 years.



PRATEKS SHRESTHA

Prateks is a fifth generation singing bowl manufacturer who co-owns the Harati Singing Bowl factory in Lalitpur, Nepal with his uncle, a renown sound master named Santa Ratna Shakya. This factory is known for the quality of the singing bowls which are made from 7 metals and hammered by hand.



RAMNARAYAN PRAJAPATI

Ram is the owner of the Peacock Shop in Bhaktapur Nepal where he runs a lokta paper factory. The prized export of the shop is a book written by his son titled 'Glimpses from Nepal: First Step into the World of Hindu and Buddhist Imagery'. Ram also collects traditional Nepali art, proudly displaying the antiquities throughout his building.



BEL BAHADUR THAPA

Bill is a village elder in Gulmi, Nepal who is passionate about preserving the traditional song and dance of the Magar people. After his retirement from the Indian army, he now spends his time playing the drums and teaching kids how to dance.



TOPALA THAPA & LAUMAYA SHRIS


Topala & Laumaya are notable farmers and social workers from the Gulmi area in Nepal who are working to perserve the traditional language, dress, and customs of the Magar people by it's inclusion in the local school's curriculum.



DEV TARAMU

Dev is an artisan living in the foothills of the Himalyas who learned the trade of basketweaving from an early age by watching his father. In the film, Dev stops by our campsite to illustrates how to make a nanglo (serving tray) from bamboo which he harvested the day prior.




